

FORT PIERRE CITY COUNCIL  
APPROVED MINUTES  
REGULAR MEETING  
April 15, 2019

The regular meeting of the Fort Pierre City Council was called to order by Mayor Hanson at 6:30 pm. Members present for Roll Call were Bernhard, Cronin, Gabriel, LaRoche, and Weisgram. Ricketts was absent. Officials present were Cromwell, Hahn, Heezen, Thorson, and Tibbs.

**Agenda.** Gabriel moved and Weisgram seconded to approve the agenda. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**Conflict of Interest Declarations.** No conflict of interest was declared.

**Reports.** 1.) Hanson thanked and extended her appreciation to Gabriel for his dedication to the City and council. 2.) Hanson reported to council that on 4/18/19 Toby Morris was meeting with area banks and the Finance Committee for financial commitment. 3.) Hanson informed council that Ricketts had heart valve replacement last week and is doing well. 4.) Heezen reported to council that staff had been busy interviewing for the Street Maintenance and Electric Lineman positions. 5.) Hahn informed council that he had attended the Corps public meeting on the water levels in the Oahe Dam and their plan for spring runoff into the Missouri. He felt they were in good shape in their planning and controlling of the levels it would just be dependent on the weather and moisture received. 6.) Thorson reported on the snow plowing that took place during the recent blizzard.

Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**Personnel-Streets.** Heezen informed council four interviews were conducted and staff recommended hiring Shane Nickels at a rate of \$25/hour for the Street Maintenance Lead Worker position. LaRoche moved and Weisgram seconded to hire Shane Nickels at a rate of \$25/hour for the Street Maintenance Lead Worker position. Motion passed on Voice Vote. Cronin abstained.

**4<sup>th</sup> of July.** Heezen informed council she had been approached by a fireworks vendor on extending the sale/use of fireworks into the weekend after the Fourth of July. After reviewing State Statute and discussion on the pros and cons of extending the time period, Bernhard moved and Weisgram seconded to table until the 5/6/19 meeting. Motion passed on Voice Vote.
