

FORT PIERRE CITY COUNCIL  
REGULAR MEETING  
June 18, 2018

The regular meeting of the Fort Pierre City Council was called to order by Mayor Hanson at 6:30 pm. Members present for Roll Call were Bernhard, Cronin, Gabriel, LaRoche, Ricketts and Weisgram. Officials present were Cromwell, Hahn, Heezen, Thorson, and Tibbs.

**Agenda.** Gabriel moved and Weisgram seconded to approve the agenda. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**Conflict of Interest Declarations.** No conflict of interest was declared.

**Reports.** 1.) Mayor Hanson reported on her trip to Pensacola, FL to speak on the Waldron Documentary at the US Naval Aviation Museum. 2.) Heezen informed council that budget request letters had been sent out last week. 3.) Heezen reported that sales tax thru April was down 2.3% YTD, BBB thru April was down 6.5% YTD, and Occupancy Tax thru April was up 1.8% YTD. 4.) Heezen informed council that there were 76 residents that had participated in the coupons for clean-up which amounted to 17 tons of rubble costing \$972. 5.) Hahn reported to council he would be sending out RFP proposals for the museum on moving the electrical inside. 6.) Hahn reported he would be getting proposals for curb and gutter on 6<sup>th</sup> Street. 7.) Hahn informed council that, in trying to deal with the speeding on Verendrye, stop signs had been put up, but they have since been taken down and replaced with speed limit signs. The Sheriffs will also do more patrolling of that area. 8.) Cronin asked about the status of the meter upgrade project. He was informed it was almost complete with a few water meters left to install.

**Public Comments.** Brian Hanson asked about the weight restriction on Verendrye. Hanson said a tour bus to the Casey Tibbs Rodeo Center would exceed the current limits for that road. Hahn informed that the load limits on Verendrye is 10,000 pounds currently according to ordinance and that it was necessary to start enforcing as Verendrye is not a truck route and there should be no through trucks using it as such. The exemption to the ordinance is going to a specific location/destination on the road and then return to a truck route. Law enforcement has been asked to start warning people of the load limits. Jim Hoffman was also present with concerns on the load limits being placed on Verendrye. Hahn indicated that an ordinance adjustment is needed, possibly to 20,000 pounds.

**Consent Calendar.** Cronin moved and Bernhard seconded to approve the following Consent Calendar item: 6/4/18 Minutes. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**Public Hearing.** Mayor Hanson opened a public hearing at 6:59 pm for the purpose of getting public input on the Temporary Liquor License at the Pat Duffy Community Youth Center on 7/25/18 for the Red Willow Band. She asked for proponents to the license. She heard none. She asked for opponents to the license. She heard none. Bernhard moved and Ricketts seconded to approve the Temporary Liquor License at the Pat Duffy Community Youth Center on 7/25/18 for the Red Willow Band. Motion passed on Voice Vote. Hanson declared an end to the public hearing at 7:00 pm.

**2018 Missouri River-Lake Sharpe Cleanup.** Paul Lepisto presented a power point on the Missouri River-Lake Sharpe Cleanup efforts. Last year they cleaned up 1.27 tons of garbage from the river-lake area with 80 volunteers and have posted numerous signs promoting litter control. The event will take place on 7/11/18 from 5-8 pm at Downs Marina. Weisgram moved and Ricketts seconded to approve \$250 to be spent at Dakotamart in Fort Pierre. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**Cody Briggs-Stop signs on Verendrye Drive.** Cody Briggs expressed his concerns about safety with stop signs being placed on Verendrye. He was informed they had been removed and efforts are being made to increase patrolling on Verendrye Drive to enforce the current speed limits.

**2018 Plumbing & Electric Licenses.** Cronin moved and Ricketts seconded to approve 2018 licenses for Antonio's Plumbing for a plumbing license and All Seasons Electric for an electric license. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

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**Set Public Hearing on 7/2/18 to Transfer On-Off Sale Wine License.** Ricketts moved and Bernhard seconded to set a public hearing on 7/2/18 to transfer On-Off Sale Wine License from Freshstart to BW Gas & Convenience. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**Set Public Hearing on 7/2/18 to Transfer Package Liquor License.** LaRoche moved and Cronin seconded to set a public hearing on 7/2/18 to transfer Package Liquor License from Freshstart to BW Gas & Convenience. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**Set Public Hearing on 7/2/18 to Transfer On-Off Sale Malt Bev License.** Weisgram moved and Cronin seconded to set a public hearing on 7/2/18 to transfer the On-Off Sale Malt Bev License from Freshstart to BW Gas & Convenience. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**Executive Session.** Bernhard moved and Ricketts seconded to enter into Executive Session at 7:15 pm pursuant to SDCL 1-25-2(3) consulting with legal counsel about pending contractual matters. Mayor Hanson declared an end to Executive Session at 7:25 pm.

**Accept form and content of Purchase Agreement for Teton Island Lots 4A & 4B.** Bernhard moved and Ricketts seconded to accept the form and content of the purchase Agreement for lots 4A & 4B dated 6/8/18 for \$2.75/sq foot with \$30,000 nonrefundable earnest money closing on or before 3/29/19. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**Bids and Award for Hay Ground.** The following bids were received: Lee Smith \$1250, Jim Hicks \$1201, Brody Andersen \$450, Dave Peck \$450. Cronin moved and LaRoche seconded to accept Lee Smith's bid in the amount of \$1250 for the hay ground. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**Water System Study RFP's and Selection for Engineering Services.** Hahn informed council that 6 proposals were received for the Water System Study and he recommends Interstate Engineering proposal of \$34,462. Ricketts moved and Cronin seconded to approve Interstate Engineering in the amount of \$34,462 for the Water System Study. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**Quotes and Award for Demo of Old City Shop.** The following bids were received: Sharpe \$6,800, AGE \$9,000, R&W \$14,100, Morris \$16,300, Quality Concrete \$16,500, Briggs Trucking \$17,857, Anderson Contractors \$24,915, Sol Bros Construction \$39,037.05. Cronin moved and LaRoche seconded to accept the proposal from Sharpe Enterprises Inc in the amount of \$6,800 for demolition of the old City Shop. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**2018-2019 Mobile Home Court Licenses.** Weisgram moved and LaRoche seconded to approve Duffy and Schaefer for the 2018-2019 Mobile Home Licenses. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**Authorization to Advertise for Bids for Hwy 83/Bad River Bridge Water Line Replacement Project.** Bernhard moved and Gabriel seconded authorization to advertise for bids for the highway 83/Bad River Bridge water line replacement project. Motion passed on Voice Vote.
