

FORT PIERRE CITY COUNCIL
APPROVED MINUTES
REGULAR MEETING
Monday, July 18, 2022

The regular meeting of the Fort Pierre City Council was held at the SD Municipal League conference room and called to order by Mayor Hanson at 5:15 pm. Members in attendance for Roll Call were Bernhard, L Cronin, R Cronin, Deal, Iversen, and Kenzy. Officials in attendance were Cromwell, Hahn, Heezen, Thorson and Tibbs. Meeting was also held via Zoom.

Approval of Agenda. L Cronin moved and Kenzy seconded to approve the agenda as amended. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

Conflict of Interest Declarations. No Conflict of Interest was declared.

Reports. 1.) Hanson reported to council on the Yellowstone clean-up/development process and the ground breaking was slated for the end of July. 2.) Heezen informed council the office will be updating the server for enhanced reliability/security. 3.) Heezen reminded council that committee meetings will be scheduled to discuss the budget. 4.) Heezen reported to council that the field work for audits of the City and Law Enforcement had been completed. 5.) Hahn handed out a WAPA update and explained the effects the drought was having on the production of electricity through hydropower. That the City along with other cities had been notified of possible brown/blackouts due to current demand/production ratio. He explained the Gen Station would lessen the chance of Fort Pierre experiencing the blackouts. 6.) Thorson informed council that chip seal had been completed last week. 7.) Iversen gave an update on the activities and entertainment that have been scheduled for Trader Days August 12 through the 14.

Temp Liquor License-Chateau. Bernhard moved and L Cronin seconded to approve the Temporary Liquor License for the Chateau on 8/13/22 for Trader Day's activities. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

Right of Way Closure Permit-Trader Days. R Cronin moved and Deal seconded to approve a Right of Way Closure permit on Deadwood to just around the corners on East Main from 9 am to 2 am on 8/13/22 for Trader Day's activities. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

2022 Plumbing License-Woodring Plumbing. L Cronin moved and Iversen seconded to approve a 2022 Plumbing License for Woodring Plumbing. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

Ditch Clean-out. Kenzy asked about the clean-out of ditches around the City that had been identified a few years ago and what the status of those were. Staff informed council that work has been done on them and options discussed. Council was also reminded that there is no street department summer help.

Public Comment. Bill Fischer, Fort Pierre resident, brought eight areas of concern before the council. Hanson once again informed him several of those areas are being dealt with, they didn't happen overnight and won't be remedied overnight.
