

**FORT PIERRE CITY COUNCIL  
REGULAR MEETING  
September 6, 2011**

The regular meeting of the Fort Pierre City Council was called to order by Mayor Tidball at 7:30 pm. Members present for Roll Call were Bernhard, Briggs, Gabriel, Paul, Rathbun, and Ricketts. Officials present were Fischer, Heezen, Lawrence and Thorson.

**Agenda.** Briggs moved and Paul seconded to approve the agenda. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**Consent Calendar.** Bernhard moved and Briggs seconded to approve the following Consent Calendar items: 8/15/11 Minutes; Raffle Permit-FP Fire Dept-10/1/11; Open Container Permit-FP Fire Dept-10/1/11; Travel-Lawrence-SDWARN mtg Nashville 9/13-9/15. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

Ricketts moved and Rathbun seconded to pay the claims as submitted. Motion passed on Voice Vote

**Reports.** 1.) Heezen updated council on the amount drawn from the loan for flood related expenses. 2.) Heezen reported on FEMA PW's processed to date. 3.) Lawrence indicated that he has had inquiries for burning tree debris piles. The council recommended coordinating supervised burns of trees only with the fire department. 4.) Lawrence reported that plans are being developed with the assistance of Brosz for levee and road raise removal and the work will be done in phases, with the levee removal that involved the road raise removal so be completed first. The Council discussed the completion date of phase one and agreed that December 1 would be the desired completion date. The council also discussed the need to lift the time restrictions to allow contractors to work into the night as necessary for completion of the project. 5.) Lawrence indicated that concern has been expressed about the condition of the trees in the ROW. The council discussed getting a tree expert to inspect the trees to help determine the need for removal. 6.) Lawrence reported that training might be necessary for City staff to be able to assist in the process of declaring substantial damage. ICC staff would be available to help with the process or train staff on what needs to be done. 7.) Tidball reported that the water committee met with WRLJ committee to discuss terms of an agreement and the rate structure. 8.) Tidball reported that a group of volunteers would be assisting with the sandbag removal process in the Dunes Drive area. 9) Ricketts inquired on plans for asphaltting and stressed the importance of detailed timesheets to allow for accurate tracking of costs by project.

**Adjournment.** With no further business, Tidball declared the meeting adjourned at 9:03 p.m.
