

FORT PIERRE CITY COUNCIL  
REGULAR MEETING  
November 21, 2016

The regular meeting of the Fort Pierre City Council was called to order by Mayor Hanson at 6:30 pm. Members present for Roll Call were Bernhard, Gabriel, LaRoche, Ricketts, and Weisgram. Cronin was absent. Officials present were Cromwell, Hahn, Heezen, Thorson, and Tibbs.

**Agenda.** Gabriel moved and Weisgram seconded to approve the agenda. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**Conflict of Interest Declarations.** No Conflict of Interest Declaration was declared.

**Consent Calendar.** LaRoche moved and Weisgram seconded to approve the following Consent Calendar items: 11/07/16 Minutes; Raffle Permits: Stanley County School Wrestling Building fundraiser. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**Public Hearing - Discharge Firearms-Dunes Golf.** Mayor Hanson opened a public hearing at 6:33 pm for the purpose of getting public input on the discharge of Firearms in City Limits at Dunes Golf Course. She asked for proponents of the Discharge of Firearms Permit, Deis informed council he was not aware of any complaints and that he had a Certificate of Insurance in place and would provide the City with a copy. Bob Gray spoke on behalf of Dunes, being the closest neighbor he didn't even notice when hunters were there. She asked for opponents of the Discharge of Firearms Permit. She heard none. LaRoche mentioned that he had been approached by residents of that area with concerns of safety. Weisgram asked how long goose season lasted and what were the hours. Deis informed him that the season ends the second week of February and hours are sunup to sundown. The following resolution was presented:

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Pierre held public hearing to address concerns regarding the issuance of a license to discharge firearms within the City limit for the hunting of waterfowl with a shotgun as requested by Dunes Golf Inc at the property described as Gov't Lot 4 less Lot A & B, Lot 1 of Sec 16 Twp 5 Range 31, City of Fort Pierre, Stanley County; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Pierre requires the applicant to adequately post the area to notify passers by of any possible risk due to hunting and to use any other necessary precautions in regards to safety; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Pierre requires the applicant to provide proof of adequate insurance that names the City as an additional insured on the policy; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Pierre requires the applicant to pay a fee in the amount of \$50 for their license; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Pierre will honor such license conditional on the above terms from the date of passage through 6/30/17; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to City Ordinance M-3-5 the City Council, in and for the City of Fort Pierre, South Dakota does hereby approve the license to discharge firearms, within the City limits within the boundaries described herein, to the applicant conditional of them meeting the terms listed above.

This resolution is effective upon passage.

Ricketts moved and Bernhard seconded to approve Res #2016-23 authorizing the Discharge of Firearms at Dunes Golf Course. Motion passed on Voice Vote with LaRoche opposed. Hearing no further comments, Hanson declared an end to the public hearing at 6:35 pm.

**Public Hearing – Discharge of Firearms-Anderson & Buchholtz.** Mayor Hanson opened a public hearing at 6:35 pm for the purpose of getting public input on the Discharge of Firearms Permit – Anderson & Buchholtz. She asked for proponents of the discharge of Firearms, Buchholtz informed council it would be same as previous year, they also were shooting away from McClellands and a Certificate of Insurance was in place and would be provided to the City. She asked for opponents to the Discharge of Firearms Permit. She heard none. Mayor Hanson expressed concerns about pedestrians on the bike path. Buchholtz assured her that they are shooting up and the bike path is yards away. The following resolution was presented:

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Pierre held a public hearing to address concerns regarding the issuance of a license to discharge firearms within the City limit for the hunting of waterfowl with a shotgun as requested by Anderson & Buchholtz, LLP of Fort Pierre, South Dakota. The property is described as: That part of Lots 14-23 Lying East of Hwy 1806 ROW, Blk 25; Lots 14-33, Blk 26; W ½ of Lots 29-33 & all of Lots 24-28, Blk 27; Lots 1-10 and 42-46, Blk 35; and W ½ of Lots 1-6 & all of Lots 7-46, Blk 34, City of Fort Pierre, Stanley County; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Pierre requires the applicant to adequately post the area to notify passers by of any possible risk due to hunting and to use any other necessary precautions in regards to safety; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Pierre requires the applicant to provide proof of adequate insurance that names the City as an additional insured on the policy; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fort Pierre requires the applicant to pay a fee in the amount of \$50 for their license; and

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WHEREAS, the City of Fort Pierre will honor such license conditional on the above terms from the date of passage through 6/30/17; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to City Ordinance M-3-5 the City Council, in and for the City of Fort Pierre, South Dakota does hereby approve the license to discharge firearms, within the City limits within the boundaries described herein, to the applicant conditional of them meeting the terms listed above.

This resolution is effective upon passage.

Bernhard moved and Gabriel seconded to approve Res #2016-24 authorizing the Discharge of Firearms Permit for Anderson & Buchholtz. Motion passed on Voice Vote with LaRoche opposed. Hearing no further comments, Hanson declared an end to the public hearing at 6:38 pm.

**Improvements to Expo Center – Bob Gray-Oahe Hockey Assn.** Gray informed council of the updates that are being looked at for the Expo center in order to host more events and possibly a State Varsity Tournament; seating, entry way, a player’s entrance, flooring, and painting. The estimated cost is approximately \$170-180,000.

**Fort Pierre Historic Sculptures.** The first sculpture will be in 2017 of Pierre Chouteau with 5 more to follow. Pat Miller is chairman of the group that is working to capitalize on the City’s history.

**Intro Ord 1003, 2017 Utility Budget.** Ricketts moved to introduce Ord 1003 2017 Utility Budget.

**Intro Ord 1004 Utility Rates.** Weisgram moved to introduce Ord 1004 Utility Rates.

**Summer 2017 Tractor Rental \$17.50/hr @ 200 hrs (\$3,500).** Gabriel moved and Weisgram seconded to authorize the summer 2017 Tractor Rental for mowing at \$17.50/hr not to exceed 200 hrs. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**2016 Electric Department Pickup Purchase \$35,695.60.** Weisgram moved and Bernhard seconded to authorize the purchase of a pickup for the Electric Department in the amount of \$35,695.60. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**Set Public Hearing on 12/5/16 for Temp Liquor Lic at Rodeo Center for 12/10 event.** LaRoche moved and Gabriel seconded to set a public hearing on 12/5/16 for public input on a Temp Liquor license at the Casey Tibbs Rodeo Center for an event on 12/10/16. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**CCO #1 (Final) 2016 Street Project-Main Ave.** Weisgram moved and Ricketts seconded to authorize payment of CCO #1 (Final) 2016 Street Project-Main Ave to Morris Incorporated in the amount of \$14,112.42. Motion passed on Voice Vote.

**Pay Req #3 (Final) 2016 Street Project-Main Ave.** Bernhard moved and Weisgram seconded to authorize payment of Pay Req #3 (Final) 2016 Street Project-Main Ave to Morris Incorporate in the amount of \$84,136.25. Motion passed on Voice Vote.
